

2022-23 FINAL CHANGES TO THE SCHOOL QUALITY REPORTS

This document describes the final changes to the 2022-23 School Quality Reports. These changes build on the methodology described in the 2021-22 and 2018-19 Educator Guides to the School Quality Reports.

Display ratings	The rating chart on the first page of the School Quality Snapshot (and at the top of each tab) was blank for all schools due to COVID-19. Section ratings and metric ratings throughout the report were "N/A."	The ratings will resume being displayed at the top of each tab in the School Quality Snapshot and the Dashboard. The 2022-23 School Quality Reports do not incorporate targets into ratings, as they were not prepared in advance for schools to meet. The <u>2022-23 Educator Guide</u> explains how ratings are calculated for 2022-23 School Quality Reports.
Display comparison group	The Comparison Group was omitted due to COVID-19.	Comparison Group results will be calculated for the 2022-23 school year, and city/district/borough averages will be displayed on the Snapshot. The methodology for calculating Comparison Group results was updated in the 2023-24 School Quality Reports in collaboration with Blueprint Labs at MIT.
