Small Schools Data

Raising Questions about Small Schools

- Tom uplifted a question about small schools, which has also been echoed throughout many discussions in the working group.
- In response, the NYC Public Schools team gathered the following information:
 - Re-visit the data on small school breakdown by grade level that was previously shared
 - How many schools are co-located
 - Share some preliminary analysis on Tom's question



In 2021-22, there were 201 schools across the city with fewer than 200 students enrolled; school size ranges dramatically, from 44 to nearly 6,000.
