

New York City Department of Education Report on Guidance Counselors Pursuant to Local Law 56 of 2014 February 15, 2016



Report Pursuant to Reporting Requirements in Local Law 56 of 2014

Background

Chapter 3 to Title 21-A of the Administrative Code of the City of New York (Int. No. 403-A) enacted in 2014 as Local Law 56 requires annual reporting on guidance counselors no later than the fifteenth of February.

Data is gathered from various sources, including the Division of Human Resources, The Division of Teaching and Learning, the Division of Specialized Instruction and Support and the Research Policy and Support Group.

Int. No 403-A specifies that the report shall include:

i. The number of full and part-time guidance counselors and social workers in each school.

ii. The guidance counselor and social worker to student ratio in each school.

Guidance Counselor Ratio 1:353 All schools 1:224 Schools with high school grades

Guidance Counselor and Social Worker Ratio

1:250 All schools

1:172 Schools with high school grades

A low guidance counselor and social worker to student ratio doesn't mean a school is not providing counseling or postsecondary planning services. Middle and high schools often engage teachers and other school staff to support the counseling program.

iii. Whether the guidance counselor or social worker is providing counseling assistance to more than one school.

Guidance counselors – 127 schools have a guidance counselor who serves more than one location (60 guidance counselors).

Social workers – 22 schools have a social worker who serves more than one location (9 social workers)
