What is CLASS +?

- A selection of supplemental assessment scales, that allows CLASS evaluators to collect information on certain aspects of the classroom.
- Aspects include classroom environment, health and safety practices and practices that support children's emotional webeing





First an overview of CLASS+

Why are we using it?

- To provide ongoing feedback on critical aspects of classroom environments in years when programs do not receive an ECERS assessment.
- Collect data from every classroom in a program
- Provides insight on which sites may need more support with their classroom environments.



CLASS Environmental is organized into the three domains of the Prex and 3K CLASS tools:

- Emotional Support
- Classroom Organization
- Instructional Support

Items focus on three aspects of the classroom environment and activities that support higher quality teacherchild interactions:

- room arrangements
- displays
- materials








