

Local Law 93 of 2015 (Previously Local Law 6 of 2011) - Biannual Report

Pursuant to Local Law 93 of 2015, the Department of Education is required to provide reports on student discipline data (suspension data) to the City Council twice a year (October 31 and March 31). The March reporting requires citywide suspension data by month for the first half of the academic year, July through December. Per the legislation and in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act or FERPA, any value from zero (0) to five (5) has been redacted.

Two-Year Suspension Comparison at 115 School Days

Data from July – December 2018, when compared to the same time last year, July – December 2017, shows a decrease of 14% in total suspensions. Principal suspensions decreased by 11.7% and superintendent suspensions decreased by almost 20%.

Year to date, as of March 15 (115 school days), we are seeing a decrease of 11.7% in total suspensions with principal suspensions decreasing by 10.6% and superintendent suspensions decreasing by 14.5%.

EMS Student Transports 7/1/2018 - 12/31/2018

In addition, pursuant to Local Law 93 of 2015, the Department of Education is required to provide the total number of EMS transports and the number of EMS transports performed because of a student's



emotional/psychological condition to City Council twice a year (October 31 and March 31). The March reporting requires EMS data disaggregated by district and by month for the first half of the school year (July to December). Per the legislation and in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act or FERPA, any value from zero (0) to five (5) has been redacted.

Data from July – December 2018, when compared to the same time period last year, July – December 2017, shows a decrease of 5.7% in total transports, while transports for emotional/psychological conditions have increased by 1.6%
